


ACTIVITY 3




SLOGAN WRITING COMPETITION

QUIZ COMPETITION


On the occasion of Constitution Day (26th November) as well as continuing the celebration of "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav", Department






ACTIVITY 9

ACTIVITY 15

Online Lecture under MoU with RCEUS, LUCKNOW

Speaker: Himanshu Chandra, Addi. Director, RCEUS, Lucknow

Topic: 'Smart City': An Idea Revolutionising the process of

Urbanisation

23/03/22, Google Meet

The moderator began with the introduction of the Speaker and how he has contributed to the field of planning and development. After the introduction Mr. Himanshu Chandra was invited to begin with his lecture with the use of PPT.

The speaker explained how 'smart city' is headed towards informative societies and network facilitation. The idea behind such a project is to make urban spaces economically and politically viable and sustainable in the long run. He gave different names that have been used across countries for 'smart city'. To name a few: global society (Sasskia Sassen), Network Societies (M.Castell), Wireless Cities (Sukumar) and others.

Mr. Chandra went on to explain the usage of internet as crucial to interacting with the city. He gave relevant examples for explaining this such as Ola, Uber, Google Maps, etc. Here the idea is to manage all the basic amenities through such digital platforms which in turn reflect on the creation of smart city. He emphasised on the point that smart city is the one that make better choices.

Since the 74th Amendment Act there have been changes made in the administrative capabilities and more emphasis has been laid down on creating smarter ways to deal with the problems cropping up in the urban spaces. He mentioned SPV (Special Purpose Vehicles) which are acting as vehicles of change in the administration. He also gave a comparative analysis between ULB system and SPV system and spoke about the need to keep financial sustainability as a parameter in decision making.

He explained that under the smart city project there are options to also appoint private CEOs under the Company Act 2013. This will help in overcoming the lethargy and laid back attitude of functionaries under the public sector. He gave example of Indore and Bhopal and how the two cities are embarking on their path towards becoming successful smart cities. His session gave relevant examples as and when required making the technical parts seem easy. There is a new concept of smart parking which is functioning well in Connaught Place, delhi and is being replicated elsewhere.

The use of smart techniques have revolutionised many administrative functions and improvised systems such as Public transport services/ Traffic Management Control centre (TMCC), Traffic Information System, Smart Street, Pelican and Puffin Pedestrian Crossing System, Common Mobility Card (being working well in Kochi where one card is used for all payments). The techniques have helped in tracking water supply augmentation and also seek distribution management. In the water management sector various efforts have been undertaken such as waste water management, smart manholes, municipal waste management through GPS enabled vehicles, smart bins and others. Bhopal has set up an example of using street lights with energy efficiency techniques which is being imitated elsewhere. The workload has been shifted on online platforms to make it more accessible to people such as e-nagarpalika. Tourism industry is also benefitting out of these smart techniques as these platforms help in enhancing avenues for travel.



ACTIVITY 16

Online Lecture under MoU with AIGGPA, Bhopal

Department of Political Science & Public Administration organized Online Lecture under MoU by Supriya Pathak (Research Associate, AIGGPA) on 24/03/2022, Google Meet. Topic of this lecture "Acculturizing Students with Monitoring & Evaluation of Public Policy at grassroot Level"

The Speaker started with an explanation of what is the meaning of good governance and why is it important in today's scenario. It helps in resource management promoting the concept of welfare state in our country. This concept came in the backdrop of projects of World Bank which was fine tuned for Indian context.

Ms. Supriya Pathak became a member of AIGGPA through a programme 'CM's Young Professionals for Development Programme'. Under this programme young minds are inducted into the field of policy making and implementation reviewing is undertaken. There are multiple schemes which are run by the government such as Aayushman Bharat, CM Helpline, Aatmanirbhar bharat and others which are part of their review.

She pointed out that her curriculum from undergraduate helped her in understanding the field. She mentioned that new papers such as Public Personnel Administration, Developmental Administration, egovernance and other papers taught in the Department are very relevant in the field.

She discussed her experience on field and added how NRLM and self help groups by women are efficient and most worthy of praise. She discussed the work of Anganwadi women workers and how they streamline the Poshan Scheme. She has been part of a study on street vendors in rural areas focusing on their problems and what can be done to resolve the same.

She pointed out that in her profession the concept that runs is that field will have problems but count them only when you have a solution. Problem solving attitude is important in public policy.

She emphasized on the need for feedback from ground so that policies can be improved upon. Feedbacks are converted into reports which are either scrutinized by the honourable Chief Minister or by the Administrative Heads in order to create effective policies.

She concluded by inviting any student or faculty to her field and also explained that AIGGPA can be approached for job as well as internship opportunities. She expressed her willingness to help any member of IEHE with preparation for civils or for AIGGPA.



ONLINE LECTURE


Dr. Reema Sharma (Assitt. Prof., Govt. P.G.College,Bina) Topic: Making of Indian Constituent Assembly On 25/03/2022, google meet

She started by first acknowledging that Constituent Assembly was a symbol of sovereignty and self-determination to be led by the people of India. She quoted Sir Ivor Jnennings who gave three situations for the creation of nation: a great social revolution, nation throw off its foreign yoke and when nation is created by fusion of smaller political units. The Constituent Assembly was constituted by indirect elections which had a set pattern of proportional representation with single transferable vote system.

She gave the historical journey of reaching to the making of the Constituent Assembly after a long negotiation with the British. She explained in detail the arduous work of getting different ideologies represented in the Assembly. This assembly was unicameral and was

later adopted as the lower house of our Parliament. She also discussed how the situation evolved within the Assembly after the Partition.

The Assembly comprised of many committees such as major, minor and drafting. All these committees were headed by stalwarts who led the national movement at different stages. The Constitutional draft was completed in 2 years, 11 months and 18 days with 12 sessions of 165 days.





ACTIVITY 18

WORKSHOP ON RTI

Collaboration with RCVP Noronha, Bhopal 28/03/22, Offline mode

Hall 4, Attendance- 120

The moderator Dr. Promod Chaturvedi gave an outline of various online trainings being organised in this direction. He appealed that the idea is to convert problem into opportunity. He explained this by giving examples from Madhya Pradesh such as Kabadi.com (Anurag Asati), Urban Greens (Piyush) and Jabalpur's students earning lakhs from vermicompost where concerns of the society were picked up innovatively and used as employment platforms.

Dr. Chaturvedi then explained about the role of RTI. RTI was brought under Congress led UPA I where in the parliament the then Prime

Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh called RTI as the 'second freedom of India'. The system of administration was opaque before 2005 leading to corruption and lack of accountability. Mazdoor Kisan Shakti Sangathan (MKSS) started with the RTI campaign. The workers wanted to get a copy of the muster rolls and when it was denied the organisation launched a campaign aiming transparency. He also cautioned that the Act should be used for constructive purposes and not for blackmailing authorities. He also pointed one basic and crucial difference between RTI and other Acts. RTI is the only act which penalises the system. It is the only Act which has time bound resolution of the asked details.

Dr. Ajay Bhardwaj took over and explained the need for such a workshop. He explained the Act through the use of PPT. He started with the origin and aim of the Act and why it is crucial for citizens to access it. He also explained that the Act provides facilitation via Public Information Officer (PIO) in case an information seeker is illiterate.

Dr. Bhardwaj mentioned various acts which have been continuing since the British and have been changed recently.

He explained that Rajiv Gandhi saw the problems in the system and tried to change it by restructuring the system but the final structure could only be brought after a campaign led by MKSS (1994) which later got picked up by Anna Hazare against corruption. The term 'grassroot' has been used by leftists and had been picked up in determining the target groups.

The workshop aimed at acquainting students with the who should be approached when filing an RTI, whom do you address your application, which language is used for writing the application, who cannot use RTI to seek information, process of response after filing of RTI, in case of disagreement whom can the appeal be addressed to, exemptions for applicants belonging to BPL families, what is the timeline for receiving response, which information can be sought in terms of time period, can complaints be made via RTI and other such crucial questions were taken up in detail. He also spoke of provisions where a third party can seek information as well beginning with the explanation of who is 'third party'. He also discussed list of absolute exemptions from the Act which are mentioned in chapter 6.



ACTIVITY 19 NPTEL ORIENTATION AND REGISTRATION

An orientation for SWAYAM NPTEL online courses was held on **20**, **21 and 22nd January 2022.** The session was attended by the students of Political Science Department. Thirty -Three students from 2nd Year enrolled for Introduction to Political Ideologies: Contexts, Ideas and Practices and three of them registered for examination.
